## Welcome to Sandringham

I am delighted to welcome you to Sandringham School. We are very proud of our learning environment and the high standards of achievement reached by all students at the school in their personal development and academic success.

Sandringham is a high performing school, graded Outstanding by Ofsted, which sets aspirational targets to challenge students to achieve more than they might feel is possible.

The school has achieved many accolades over the years. Our aim is to deliver a truly World Class education for students and results consistently demonstrate strength in all areas of the curriculum. We were one of the first schools in the country to gain the prestigious World Class Schools Quality Mark recognising not only outstanding academic performance but also the significant wider skills developed in our students. The school offers outstanding opportunities in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects as well as a key focus on cultural activities in the Arts. Our High Starters programme is extensive and designed to challenge and inspire students at the highest level. We hold International School status and work extensively

with schools in other countries to broaden our students' understanding of the world at large. Sandringham is also one of the National Teaching Schools in England, and part of our work involves leading the training and development of the very best teachers across Hertfordshire. In the last year, we have taken on the roll as Research Schools Hub for the region, promoting work between academics and professionals in education.

We have helped establish the Alban Academies Trust, a multi-academy trust set in St. Albans for schools in the primary and secondary sector to work together to improve educational outcomes for young people. This is an exciting development and should enable all young people to receive the highest quality state education possible.

We believe that every child can succeed in life if challenged and inspired appropriately. A strong academic curriculum supported by outstanding extra-curricular provision helps Sandringham students develop as individuals with the necessary skills to be very successful in adult life.

Our blend of traditional values combined with creativity and innovation offers a rich environment for progress. The quality of teaching and breadth of curriculum ensures students



consistently achieve the highest possible standards in their public examinations. We also believe it is essential to provide opportunities for young people to take responsibility for leading the learning of others thus strengthening their independence and maturity.

# The learning curriculum

Our curriculum at Sandringham consists of a varied and exciting range of subjects designed to meet the needs of all of our students and help them to reach their full potential. All students study a compulsory core curriculum of academic subjects. At each key stage, these are complemented and enhanced by a wealth of other subjects and modules that enable all students to develop existing talents and discover new ones.

We take pride in personalising the curriculum to ensure that the interests and talents of students are met even before they start with us; liaising closely with primary schools to give every student the best possible start at Sandringham. The year 7 induction programme begins in the summer of year 6 and students quickly become confident members of the Sandringham community.

In the senior school, our well-established and highly successful post-16 partnership with Beaumont and Verulam Schools provides sixth form students with access to an unparalleled range of courses and subject expertise.

All students are able to use technology to support their learning across the school, and the blended learning environment provides a powerful base to enhance learning at all levels.

To deliver the appropriate levels of stretch and challenge, students are taught in both mixed ability groups and sets. This gives us the best of both worlds and offers an excellent blend of learning environments to suit everyone. Our High Starters programme provides a rich and challenging extension to the curriculum for students with particular strengths, whilst those students with learning difficulties are nurtured so they too can fulfil their potential.



# Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM)







Through an extensive investment in the teaching of science, maths and technology, we aim to increase students' interest and achievement in these important areas of the curriculum.

Using a variety of teaching methods including an enquiry based approach, students develop their skills, knowledge and understanding of the world around them.

Science and maths are delivered by an innovative team of staff in an outstanding learning environment. Science occupies a suite of newly refurbished laboratories and part of a recently built £3 million teaching block, with state of the art facilities. Maths also occupies this new teaching block together with computing science, resulting in a vibrant and exciting place to learn and study.

We have established a challenging curriculum in science and maths to meet the needs of all students, with large numbers following triple science at GCSE and many opting for A-level maths and sciences in the Sixth Form. We strongly promote STEM subjects at University and have significant numbers of students entering science, engineering and maths (STEM) courses at undergraduate level. In particular, we have been very successful in supporting students to study medicine and actively promote this key career amongst our student population.

There are many additional activities offered to enrich the STEM subjects with clubs in astronomy, amateur radio, computing science, maths, technology and the environment as examples. There is also a science and engineering club with projects such as rocket making.

The extended community programme of science lessons and lectures add an extra dimension to interest in the sciences. We also have a wildlife area including a large pond on the school site that is used by students from Sandringham and local junior schools.

Our STEM programme of additional activities is co-ordinated by senior staff and provides an inspirational environment to stimulate interest. For example, we were selected to be the first school to make live contact with astronaut Tim Peake on the International Space Station in 2016, sent a high-altitude balloon into near space in 2017 and all students planted a tree in Heartwood Forest in 2018.



# The Arts at Sandringham









Our aim is to help students develop their self-confidence, emotional intelligence and motivation through participation in the arts.

Sandringham has a very strong record of achievement in the Arts, both performing and visual and currently holds Artsmark Platinum status recognising the highest levels of arts education. We have always recognised and valued the benefits of a broad education encompassing the Arts to help young people acquire the critical skills of communication, working in collaboration and problem solving. All students study art, music, drama and dance at KS3 and many students select at least one of these subjects at KS4. We also have many students completing their bronze and silver Trinity College Arts Award qualifications. A number of students go on to study one or more of the arts subjects at A-level and then opt to follow undergraduate courses in the arts at University.

Staff in the arts faculties provide exceptional learning to students at Sandringham and to many junior schools through our extensive outreach programme. There are numerous arts activities run each year and many of these take place in the SandPit theatre: a truly stunning 280 seater air-conditioned auditorium which provides a professional standard venue within which young people can learn, practise and perform. The opportunity to be involved in whole-school productions brings students of all ages together and gives them a sense of pride and satisfaction in their achievements.

Students benefit significantly from this curriculum and become articulate, motivated and flexible learners.



# International focus and extended opportunities







We aim to support students, helping them to understand and deal with the global nature of our world.

We aim to provide a rich and diverse range of activities that expand the horizons of our students, motivate them and develop their talents. All students are encouraged to participate in clubs, teams, workshops, visits, performances and other activities.

We also aim to support students to understand and deal with the global nature of our World. The majority of students follow at least one foreign language (French, German or Spanish) to GCSE level. Our International Status means we are linked with schools in the Gambia and in Europe, with many regular exchange visits and trips taking place to France, Germany and Spain.

We run six Extended Learning Days throughout the year to add to the excitement of learning and stimulate deep learning provided through extended projects. These dovetail with our curriculum to ensure coherent and powerful learning experiences. There is an extensive range of trips to all parts of the globe. A team building trip to the Peak District is run in the third week of term for all new year 7 students; in year 8 the students spend a week in Brittany, France or a week in the Rhineland, Germany. There are subject specific field trips for examinations students at KS4 and A-level such as the geography trip to Iceland. We run many international visits and music tours, and Sixth Formers have the opportunity of a once in a lifetime trip to an exotic destination such as Borneo, China, Central America, Bakino Faso, Nepal and Ecuador. Every two years, we take students to our link school in The Gambia, West Africa. Lower and upper school ski trips add to a fully comprehensive offering for all students.

The values of meeting challenges and being an independent learner are partly delivered through the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme.

This is a core feature of activity in years 10–13 with large numbers of students completing awards at Bronze, Silver and Gold level and adds significant value to the development of students' leadership skills as well as being great fun.





# Developing character: encouraged, supported and challenged







We believe that students learn best when they are in an environment in which they feel safe and secure. Students find it easy to settle into life and learning at Sandringham and consequently make exceptional progress.

Developing character and resilience is a key feature of our work with students.

Students' learning is supported through a highly developed pastoral system which enables them to work within clear boundaries. Students are allocated a tutor group on arrival and have the stability of working in this group as they progress through the school. The tutor and Performance Director for the year group play a vital role in supporting and encouraging each individual and are the first point of contact between school and home. Regular tutor periods allow tutors to monitor the progress and wellbeing of their students and to provide individuals with the mentoring, support and guidance they need. Our comprehensive academic mentoring, based on rigorous assessment each term, allows the tutor and Performance Director to have a clear picture of

each student's progress across the curriculum. Annual Parent Teacher Consultation evenings and a Learning Review Day allow teachers, students and parents to meet to reflect upon successes and set targets for the future.

Within tutor groups, students experience a dynamic programme of Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship education. This structured curriculum focuses on important life-skills and makes a valuable contribution to each individual's personal development. In addition, all students are allocated to a House and take part in regular House activities throughout the year. This adds the important element of 'competition' to events and provides students with the opportunity to take pride in representing their House and to work collaboratively with students from other year groups.

We have introduced an exciting character development programme that provides all students with opportunities to become involved in activities that enhance their personal qualities and will enable them to become even more confident in their outlook. The six character traits are aspiration, initiative, confidence, resilience, integrity and tolerance.

Our Student Leadership Team meet weekly, adding a significant extra dimension to the life of the school. They are responsible for advising on development of the campus, help to appoint staff and represent the views of students at staff meetings. More importantly, they have a powerful input into learning at Sandringham where students work with staff to improve what we do in the classroom.



# Sandringham sport and healthy lifestyles







Our aim is to ensure students are fit, healthy and take a pride in their appearance, and consequently strengthen their self-confidence and leadership skills.

Meeting personal challenges, working as part of a team and staying healthy are core values that we develop through a comprehensive PE curriculum and programme of sports activities.

Our aim is to ensure students are fit, healthy and take a pride in their appearance, and consequently strengthen their self-confidence and leadership skills. We also aim to encourage students to adopt healthy lifestyles and to prosper from good habits in the future.

All students follow a programme of Physical Education and Sport through to the end of KS4, culminating in a level 2 qualification; either GCSE or BTEC PE. In addition, many students will also follow one of the various sports or dance leaders programmes and carry out significant work leading sport with younger students. We have an exceptional team of staff in this area who provide high-quality learning experiences and run numerous sporting teams for all ages.

Sandringham Sport has grown significantly in recent years and our students compete regularly at District, County and National level with great success. We are fortunate to have a wonderful heated indoor swimming pool which adds to the quality of provision and gives students the opportunity

to improve their swimming ability, life saving and other water related activities. We also have a magnificent indoor sports centre that allows students to learn and perform to the highest level and a new full-sized flood-lit 3G area will further enhance opportunities for students. Annual sports tours for girls and boys allow the opportunity of competing outside their National environment.

The profile of health and fitness is further enhanced by two key events each year; 'Fit for Life' week where everyone (including staff) take on a personal fitness challenge and sample different activities, and the whole school 'Charity Run', where all students (and staff) enjoy a five-mile jog around the local countryside in aid of charity.



## The Sixth Form at Sandringham

We have a fantastic Sixth Form with over 340 intelligent and articulate young adults enjoying first-class facilities dedicated to post-16 learning.







The Sixth Form at Sandringham is a time of opportunities and experiences: academic, social and cultural and we aim to help students successfully complete their formal education before moving on to University or apprenticeships or employment.

Sandringham Sixth Form is open to all students, Sandringham or elsewhere, who meet our entrance criteria. Sixth Form students have full access to a very wide range of courses through our own curriculum and the longestablished BeauSandVer Educational Trust, our post-16 consortium with Beaumont and Verulam schools. We offer A-level courses together with other level 3 applied subjects. This ensures there is something to suit anyone who wishes to join the Sixth Form.

Students benefit from a wide range of specialist resources, including: dedicated teaching and seminar rooms; PC suites; and two large study areas in the Sixth Form Learning Centre. There is also a dedicated StarBucks café for sixth form to use throughout the day. Specialist subject and tutorial staff support and encourage students to become responsible,

independent learners. A structured programme of tutorials and progress monitoring engages each student in fulfilling their potential in their chosen specialist areas.

Sixth Form students play a unique and valuable role in the school, contributing actively to the wider life of the school community. They arrange and run events with younger students, demonstrating tremendous leadership and motivation – particularly through the House System. The Head Girl, Head Boy, Prefects and various House and Sports Captains play a particularly key role in school life and competition is fierce for these positions of responsibility.

We encourage all Sixth Form students to participate in enrichment activities that develop personal skills and there is a very robust Careers Education and Guidance programme which helps them prepare for Higher Education and the workplace. Part of this includes a specialist programme for Oxbridge and Medical entrants. The vast majority of our Sixth Form students move onto University education and we strongly support them to apply to the best Universities in the

Country. Equally, there is a bespoke programme for those wishing to complete apprenticeships or enter employment.

The Sixth Form is pre-University style culture with extremely high expectations and challenges, but equally high rewards at the end. It probably constitutes the best days of school at Sandringham for many students.

## Achieving success

Recognising and rewarding achievement is central to our philosophy for success and supports our core value of respect for learning.







We have a very strong reward system which celebrates all levels of success and encourages students to do their very best.

We provide a termly report to parents on their child's progress and exceptional effort is rewarded with a special letter of congratulation from the Headteacher.

Throughout the year, students receive commendations for excellent work which contribute towards various levels of awards presented in year assemblies. We also monitor attendance closely and, each term, special prizes are given to students for exceptional attendance. At the end of the year special prize-giving assemblies are held where students receive public recognition for their achievements through a variety of awards and trophies. We invite parents to these assemblies to celebrate the achievements of their children. In December, an annual Awards Evening is held for students past and present to receive their examination certificates and other prestigious school awards.

To further promote and celebrate success, staff nominate students on a termly basis for a Roll of Honour board in each curriculum area of the school. These are displayed close to each subject area and students receive congratulatory letters for their achievement. Staff send post cards home when a student has completed work to a high standard; we have recently introduced post cards for staff, where students can thank their teachers for their hard work!

Our rewards take many forms; it is important that effort and achievement of all kinds are treated as noteworthy.

A special award celebrated each Friday is the Headteacher's Commendation, which is presented to any student who has worked exceptionally hard during the previous week. We encourage students to take a real pride in their own achievements and to respect the achievement of others.
