Literacy	<b>Lexia:</b> Students with an English stanine score of 3 or less will be withdrawn from S4LL to focus on reading and comprehension. Literacy	<b>Whole School Read:</b> Copies of the whole school read will be purchased for each of the students so that they have immediate access to the novel. <b>Literacy through English</b>	In class, students are being taught in mixed-attainment groupings based on results from the most up-to-date research which shows that students make more progress in English in mixed-attainment groups rather than sets. Mixed classes mean that all teaching groups in English have an equal amount of students and all will benefit from more personalised teaching and learning.	Improvements in students' reading and writing scores evident through students' in-class assessments over the course of the year.	No cost
<b>Literacy</b>	<b>Reading Buddies:</b> Out of class reading buddies with year 12 students during Friday registration. Students will use a 'reading passport' to track reading progress and complete active reading tasks.	Improvements in students' reading skills including vocabulary, comprehension and inference. <b>Numeracy</b>	New 'Maths Framework Intervention' workbooks for students in set 5 and in Key Skills.	Improvements in students' understanding and skills to help them make progress at KS3.	School budget £599
<b>Numeracy</b>	Numicon for students in set 5.	Helps students bridge from concrete to abstract understanding in numeracy using more kinaesthetic activities. Helps students understand number operations. It is a 12-week programme which is delivered in normal lessons.	School budget £532
