In addition to the three subjects studied as part of the pathways above, students can study for qualifications in Financial Studies, EPQ and Mathematical Studies, all worth an AS Level. There is also a wide range of extra-curricular options including: Duke of Edinburgh Award, Young Enterprise, expeditions, field trips, community service, peer education, drama, music and sport.



Course Details

A Level Courses

Across the BSV Education Trust we offer you a very diverse range of A Level courses, which are organised into option blocks across the week. If you cannot study all your A levels in your own school, don't worry, you will almost certainly be able to study them across BeauSandVer.

BTEC and CTEC National Level 3 Courses

These courses are especially suitable for those students who prefer more vocational, practical subjects. These courses are, therefore, better for those students who prefer to be assessed on how they are performing throughout the whole two years of the course. However,



the new BTEC qualifications have elements that are assessed externally through an examination. Assessment is through coursework, including practicals and externally assessed tasks. Students are able to achieve the equivalent of one A Level pass at A* to E if they choose this option.

Facilities

BeauSandVer students enjoy excellent facilities across the three schools, including purpose built centres offering excellent study areas. Each school has a dedicated sixth form cafe area.



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General Entry Requirements

Year 12

Our three schools, being comprehensive, admit a wide ability range to their Sixth Forms.

Our entry requirements can be found below and further details are available from **www.beausandver.org.uk.** However, in general terms, we require applicants to have at least a 6 in the subjects you wish to study, (or their closest GCSE equivalent), and to have achieved a **minimum average point score of 4.** If you wish to study separate sciences at A Level you must achieve an APS of 6+.

How to Calculate Entry Thresholds:

Our entry thresholds are expressed in terms of average points score at GCSE.

To work this out, add together all the points for your grades, (remember that Double Science counts as two subjects), on the basis of:

For subjects graded 9-1:

Grade	9	8	7	6	5	4	3	2	1
Points	9	8	7	6	5	4	3	2	1

Then divide by the number of subjects. Short course (half) GCSEs should be included but with half the number of points e.g. grade 6 on a short course is worth 3 points. You may include up to two BTEC subjects where a pass is equivalent to a 4, a merit a 5.5 and a distinction a 7. Each BTEC counts as one GCSE.

Please note that we expect a minimum of 8 GCSEs (or equivalent) to be used in this calculation. To find your APS where fewer qualifications have been sat the total point score should be divided by 8.

On your application, you need to do this calculation using your target grades and the grades you have achieved in Year 11 mock exams in order to help you begin to decide the right level of course.

Example:

Your target grades are: Eng. Lang 8, Eng. Lit 7, Maths 9, Chemistry 7, Physics 7, Biology 7, Art 7, French 7, PE 7, & History 9. The total points for the ten subjects are (8+7+9+7+7+7+7+7+9) = 75.

Your average GCSE points score is 7.5 points and therefore you would be eligible for entry to Pathway 1 (the 3 A Level courses including separate science A Levels if you wish).

For **all** subjects, when making your selections please read the entry requirements relating to that subject very carefully. These can be found at www.beausandver.org.uk.

NB: The pathways and grade thresholds which follow relate to entry into Year 12 and have been agreed within the BSV Education Trust as a fair and common basis for advice to our students. They are based on the study of several years of results in our schools and are designed to be inclusive and optimistic. They offer guidance for the appropriate pathway but are not guarantees of success.

Points to consider when choosing courses

Enjoyment - Look at your level of interest in each subject: will it carry you through the length of the course?

Breadth - Are you choosing a mix of subjects that is so specialised that it leads in only one direction? If you are not yet certain of your career direction, it would be sensible to keep as many options open as possible.

Ability - Do you have the ability in the subject? Think how you have performed over the last two years, think about your predicted grades and ask the advice of your subject teachers: do they believe you can manage the more advanced work?

Further study - If you are planning to go on to Higher Education, check the subject requirements, e.g. Medicine requires Chemistry and Engineering requires Maths.

Career - If you know your career direction, check out what you will need; but be aware that you may change your mind later.

University destinations of BSV Education Trust students - Each year, students from our three schools successfully apply for Oxford, Cambridge and many other universities included in the Russell Group. Students consistently secure places onto the most competitive courses in a very wide range of universities.



The Application Process

■ Download and read the course descriptors from the BeauSandVer website or from the individual school websites

- Attend the appropriate information evenings speak to the teaching staff and students about your choices.
- Ask for advice from Heads of Subject and Heads of Sixth.
- Attend guidance meetings with a member of the school's senior staff.
- Choose one of the three schools to be your home school and complete the application form. You only apply to one school even if your subject choices mean that you will attend courses across the Trust. Your chosen home school will manage your application.
- Check that your application form is filled in correctly and that it is signed by you and by one of your parents/carers.
- Return your completed application form to your chosen home school no later than Friday 7th February 2020.
