COVID-19 Catch Up Premium

In June 2020 the government announced a £1 billion nationwide package of funding to 'tackle the impact of lost teaching time.' Sandringham School has been allocated £93,600, to be received in three tranches over the course of the 2020-21 academic year.

Schools are free to decide how best to use this funding, as long as they do so in accordance with the requirement that it is used to provide activities which will help students in Years 7-11 catch up on missed schooling.

This document sets out how Sandringham School has allocated the COVID-19 Catch Up Premium for 2020-21. The finding is allocated into three areas: teaching, targeted strategies and wider strategies in line with guidance from the Education Endowment Foundation here.
