Task 1: What is Sociology?

Task 2: Some key introductory ideas

Being a successful A Level student involves being able to read a textbook and summarise this reading in the form of notes. Read the pages provided in the pdf which introduce some key concepts in sociology.

Create a **one page** summary of this information (you do not need to include the information in the Activity Boxes). This summary can be in any form you want but you will be tested on the content in our first lesson.

Task 3: Sociological theories

A sociological theory is a set of ideas that tries to explain human society. In sociology there are lots of different theories and each theory explains human behaviour in a different way and sees different positives and negatives in society. We would like you to find out about three of the main sociological theories we will study using the resources identified below: **functionalism**, **Marxism** and **feminism**. For each, produce a **written summary** of their main views and ideas about society. Which theory do you agree with most and why?
