Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Dr Phil Zimbardo on Wednesday 12th October 2022 from 4pm-6.30pm online

We have found an excellent online conference for you to attend that will be delivered by Dr Philip Zimbardo, the psychologist behind the 1971 Stanford Prison Experiment. He will talk about his work and the session will then cover the subsequent collective social experiment, the Heroic Imagination Project.

Dr Philip Zimbardo is a Professor Emeritus at Stanford University. He has been described as 'a legendary teacher, someone with a gift of enthralling his audience and packing a powerful message'. He will share his views on the nature of evil, his personal encounters with evil, then revisit the Milgram obedience studies, and also explore his Stanford Prison Experiment. Then he will share the pioneering work he conducted on Shyness and its treatment, as well as the psychology of Time Perspective. Finally, he will extend Matt Langdon's hero presentation with an introduction of women as heroes.

Matt Langdon is the President of the Heroic Imagination Project and founder of the Hero Round Table. He wrote The Hero Handbook, a guide for young heroes-in-training, published through the American Psychology Association. Matt will provide an introduction to the Heroic Imagination Project, its history, its philosophy, and its programmes.
