Options Post-16

As students start Year 11, it is time to start thinking about destinations and options post 16.

There are different routes to suit different types of students and career pathways.



Post 16 routes

You must do one of the following until you're 18:

- stay in full-time education, for example at school, sixth form college of further education college
- start an apprenticeship or traineeship
- spend 20 hours or more a week working or volunteering while also doing part-time education or training



A levels: Sandringham and the BSV Trust

For A levels, entry requirements are a 6 in the subject at GCSE, 7 for Maths.

A levels are rigorous academic courses and will be assessed through terminal exams at the end of Year 13.

Sandringham process:

Initial information at the BSV Trust evening on 2nd November (online)

Sandringham Sixth Form Open Evening on 11th January

Application deadline on 2nd February



Technical and vocational qualifications

BTEC and CTEC courses

At Level 3, these can be the equivalent of 3 x A levels, or 2, or 1.

We offer 'single' BTEC and CTEC courses here. We don't offer the Diploma (3 x A levels).

Distinction* is worth A* at A level, Distinction is an A, Merit is a C.

Can be used for university and apprenticeship applications.



BTEC diplomas (Oaklands or West Herts)

Level 3 Extended Diploma: Examples include Engineering, Business and Finance, Performing and Production Arts.

Entry requirements are 4 or 5 GCSE grades at 4 or above.

Similar courses are available at Level 2 with entry requirements of GCSE grades 3 and above.

Level 3 National Foundation Diploma / **Extended Diploma in** Engineering

Engineering

This is a broad-base engineering course which covers many areas within the large Engineering sector. It is suitable for students who wish to progress to Higher Education or for those who wish to enter directly into employment. It combines substantial theoretical learning alongside an opportunity to develop practical workrelated skills. You will undertake the L3 National Foundation Diploma in the first year with the option to progress onto the L3 Extended Diploma in the second year.



T levels

Designed in partnership with employers to give you the skills and knowledge to get on in the workplace. You'll combine classroom learning with real work placements. 1 T Level is the equivalent of 3 A levels.

Duration: 2 years

Assessment: Exams, projects and practical assignments

Level of study: 3

Entry requirements: Course dependent

Work experience: At least 45 days on industry placement

Leads to: Work, higher and degree apprenticeships, college and university courses

Next steps

Start looking at college websites and open evenings to ensure that you have all information to make decisions in January.

If target grades are majority grades 3, 4 or 5, look carefully at vocational and technical options. You can apply to college alongside the Sixth Form so that two routes are available to choose from after results.

Start to think about key stage 5 courses and work towards the entry grades needed, Trial Exam grades in Nov/Dec will be used to judge your suitability for offers.

Start to think about career pathways so that you can work towards this in choosing the most suitable qualifications and pathway post 16. Sandringham School
