## **Bronze Arts Award**

We are delighted to offer all Year 7 students the opportunity to complete their Bronze Arts Award. This is an external qualification provided by Trinity College, London and celebrates their attainment across any or a combination of arts disciplines. Further information about Arts Award can be found at artsaward.org.uk

Students are able to complete their Arts Award at an appropriate pace for them and we enter students when they are ready, submitting work on a half termly basis for review and accreditation. Once students have completed the Bronze Arts Award, they have the option to progress onto the higher levels of Arts Award if they would like to do so.

Students complete a log book documenting their involvement in arts activities, their development of skills and their attendance at art related events. These can include music, dance, drama, film making, visual arts and photography. This is a fantastic opportunity for students who love the arts to develop new skills, reflect their experiences of an arts event, research an arts event and develop a portfolio to showcase their learning.

Bronze Arts Award is a Level 1 qualification on the regulated qualification framework and many of our students appreciate the opportunity to have their creative practice recognised. Arts Award is an Approved Activity Provider for the Duke of Edinburgh Award meaning that students can link their Arts Award to the DofE and that Arts Award is a recognised activity as part of the skills section of the DofE. Submissions in previous years have been truly outstanding and a real tribute to the excellent work happening both in and out of school in relation to a range of arts disciplines.

We ensure all students have the correct Arts Award journal and we also submit the work for external examination. Students will be able to attend support sessions which will be on Wednesdays from 3pm-4pm in F1.

Students are also invited to join via our Google Classroom which has all of the course information to support the completion of the Arts Award. The combined cost for the journal and entry is £36.00. Payments can be made via ParentPay. The school will also consider individual cases of financial support, where appropriate.

We hope your children will become involved in this optional, yet exciting, project within the Arts and we look forward to supporting them on their Arts Award journey.
